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## The Battle Is The Lord's

**2 Chronicles 20** details the account of Jehoshaphat facing and overcoming a mighty army. Jehoshaphat faced overwhelming odds. There was no way that he could have conquered these invading armies. There were too many for him to handle. Humanly speaking, there was no hope for Jehoshaphat and Judah in the face of this mighty and hostile coalition.

What comforting and encouraging word did he receive in **2 Chronicles 20:15**?

Jehoshaphat was told that this was not his battle; it was the Lord's. For that reason, he was not to despair or to be discouraged. God sends this message to

Jehoshaphat to strengthen and encourage his faith.

There are times when our spiritual warfare seems overwhelming. It appears that evil is rampant and gaining ground. When we look around, it seems as if Satan is working unchecked.

Yet, we cannot let the circumstances dictate our faith nor our determination to stand firm for the Lord. The battle is not ours; it is the Lord's. This is His battle. Our responsibility is to trust Him and to continue to wage war. He will grant the victory in His time. Let us then be faithful to our Commander-in-Chief!

This is especially applicable to our prayerwalking. When we hit the streets to pray, we can get overwhelmed by what we see – the sin, the strongholds,

the suffering of people. Yet, we must remember that the battle is the Lord's! We are not going out on our mission – it's God's mission (**Matthew 28:19-20**). We are not going out in our strength; we are going out in the strength of our Lord (**Ephesians 6:10**).

What situations in your church and area discourage you?

Will you commit these to your Commander-in-Chief today? Commit each on into His hand, asking Him to strengthen and encourage you to continue to stand firm no matter what you see or feel.

*“Father, I adore You because You are the sovereign God. I exalt You because You are the mighty Warrior. I am thankful that the battle is Yours. I plead with You to give me the strength and the wisdom to continue faithful in the spiritual war. Make me into a mighty warrior that tears down strongholds and sets the captives free. Create within me a clean heart and a right spirit. Amen.”*

## Praying Bigger Than Yourself Ephesians 3:20-21

The Bible reveals that God is the mighty God who works in powerful and unique ways. He has all power in heaven and earth. He is the source of all wisdom. His goodness is rich and abiding. Because of who God is, you can make bold requests of Him. You can plead with Him for the impossible.

Consider and evaluate your prayer requests. Do you pray boldly to God? Are you praying and believing Him for the impossible? How would you describe your making requests of God?

Read and meditate on **Ephesians 3:20-21**. Record any insights that you receive.

Who are you praying to?

What is God able to do?

How is God able to do it?

*Praise God today for His mighty power that is able to do beyond what you think or feel. Ask Him to empower you to pray for the impossible. Call on Him to increase your faith that you might receive from Him. Plead with Him for a clean heart and a right spirit.*

How do you think this verse applies to prayerwalking?

This verse is a challenge to your faith. It is calling on you to step out of your comfort zone. It is pleading with you to ask God for the impossible. It is teaching you to pray bigger than yourself - to pray beyond what you think or feel God can do. As you prayerwalk, God wants you to pray for the great and mighty things. He is willing and able to do these things. Yet, you must ask Him and believe Him.

Making bold requests of God is a way of glorifying and honoring God. When we pray boldly, it is our way of saying that we believe in the personal, powerful God of heaven and earth. When we ask for what is beyond us, it is our way of confessing that we believe that God is able. Bold praying seeks to honor and glorify the goodness and power of God.
